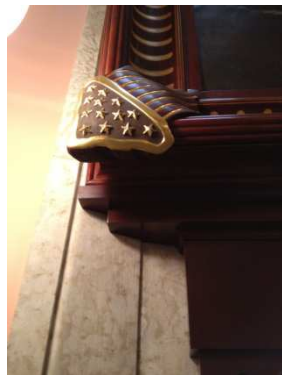

What did he do? The Women's Relief Corps, the auxiliary of the largest and most influential Civil War veteran's organization, the Grand Army of the Republic, commissioned the statue from Bruce Wilder Saville, a faculty member at Ohio State University. The statue was unveiled in 1923, and in honoring service during the war was intended to recognize the contributions of the troops in the fields and the women they left behind.
